



The Mansion at Cabrini College Master Plan

Designed by Horace Trumbauer and built for James W. Paul Jr. between 1901 and 1903, the Woodcrest Mansion stands as a testament to the Paul legacy and serves as the architectural centerpiece of the campus. Trumbauer blended several architectural styles and used a variety of materials, including limestone, fieldstone, brick, timber, and stucco. The building features numerous grotesques, which reflect the family's interest in hunting.



In 2004, KSK prepared a master plan and designs for the complete restoration of the Mansion so it could be used for administrative offices, faculty offices, and public event space. The scope of work included replacement of all building systems, evaluation and treatment recommendations for the historic interior and exterior materials and finishes, and interior design services.
